We are improving our product labeling and packaging. Over the next few months, you may notice changes to our product labeling as a result of this initiative. We are also updating our document and label formatting. There are no changes to our immunoassay products.

Some of the improvements include:

- > Symbols that replace product labeling text, harmonizing our global packaging
- > A comprehensive glossary of the symbols used in our immunoassay packaging
- > Removal of the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labeling of Chemicals (GHS) warning information from our kit packaging
- > A return to the specific disease state color identifiers on our packaging for easier inventory maintenance
- > Increased font size on our immunoassay reagent, calibrator and control packaging
